Trauma / Bloodborne Pathogens

What the owner should know right away



- Compliments of your insurance agent

Trauma / Bloodborne pathogens:



All human blood and most human body fluids are treated as if known to be infectious for HIV, HBV, and other blood-borne pathogens. Exposure has serious health consequences.

Step 1: Determine if an Exposure Incident has occurred

Did anyone have eye, mouth, other mucous membrane, non-intact skin, or parenteral contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials? If so, immediately administer first aid with emphasis on cleansing the affected area. Obtain a sample of the potentially infectious materials if you can do so safely. Provide prompt medical evaluation. Complete OSHA #301 if the Incident is work-related.

Step 2: Prevent an Exposure Incident

Wash hands and any other skin with soap and water immediately following contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials. Wash again after removal of gloves or other personal protective equipment.



If a garment is penetrated by blood or other potentially infectious materials, the garment shall be removed immediately. Leave the garment in the contaminated area.



Do not use or remove food and drink in refrigerators, freezers, shelves, cabinets or on countertops or bench tops where blood or other potentially infectious materials are present.

Do not eat, drink, smoke, apply cosmetics or lip balm, or handle contact lenses in the contaminated area. Evacuate the contaminated area until the area has been restored.



Step 3: Call for help

Call your insurance agent. Clean-up and restoration of trauma and potential bloodborne pathogens services are covered by most homeowners or business insurance policies. Ask for a claim number.
